

Far removed from the hustle and bustle of a big city like Tokyo, the Misawa area is very picturesque with much of the charm and traditions of old Japan still present.



# The 6921st Security Wing Complex

Situated four and a half miles from Misawa AB proper is the 6921st Security Wing. Commonly referred to as "the Hill" by main base personnel, the Wing is a separate community in itself.

The Wing is supported by the 6989th Support Squadron which handles all the administrative and house-keeping duties.

## *The Misawa Air Base Story*

Misawa was built by the Japanese prior to World War II with the idea of establishing a northern bomber

base from which to launch long range aircraft toward Alaska in the event of War with the United States. When the plan failed to materialize, the Japanese used the base to train Army and Navy pilots and to test new aircraft.

In 1946, the 39th Air Division began their occupancy of Misawa AB. Recently, the 39th Air Division was redesignated the 475th Tactical Fighter Wing and today consists of two fighter squadrons, an Air Base Group and other tactical and support organizations. In addition to the 6921st Security Wing, Misawa AB is the home for 18 other tenant units.

## General Information

### *Climate*

Climatic conditions here are similar to the East coast of the United States with cold winters and mild summers. Oh sure, you'll see plenty of snow but it doesn't stay on the ground very long and the base is equipped to cope with it. The temperatures in the winter seldom goes below 20 degrees and the annual average snow fall will exceed 100 inches. Winds will get gusty at times.

Summers are mild with an average temperature of 79 degrees and the area will get more than its share of rain during the summer months.

### *Clothing and Uniforms*

Both summer and winter wardrobes are a necessity at Misawa. Military personnel wear the winter uniform from October 15 through May 15 and the summer blues

are worn the rest of the year. Wind breakers and boots are useful items and can be purchased in the Base Exchange along with a complete line of both summer and winter clothing. Uniforms, suits, fine quality coats and dresses can be tailor made either in one of the BX concessions or in one of the many tailor shops located in Misawa City for much less than one would pay in the United States.

With the exception of certain social events, informality in off-duty dress is the rule. Civilian dress usually consists of sports clothes, slacks, sweaters and jackets. Misawa has its own Clothing Sales Store and the BX also carries a line of military clothing items.

### *Automobile*

Large American cars are more of a liability than an asset. Speed limits are low and distances between points of interest on the base are small. Off base roads are narrow and risky and cars are driven on

the left side of the road. A small car is ideal here and used cars can be purchased with no problem.

If you do decide to ship your stateside automobile you can expect a delay of 60 to 90 days after arrival on Misawa until you get your car. Automobiles first arrive in Yokohama, outside Tokyo, where it will await shipment to Hachinohe by LST. Hachinohe is approximately 20 miles from the Air Base.

The annual cost of registering a vehicle is approximately \$100. In addition to the regular 5-10-5 insurance requirement, the Japanese government requires purchase of Japanese Compulsory Insurance at the rate of \$25 a year and Japanese Road Tax which also

amounts to \$25 annually. Gasoline, however, is inexpensive — 17.9 cents a gallon at the BX Service Station.

### *Household Goods*


All families assigned to Japan are authorized 2,000 pounds of household goods. The base provides every necessary item of household furniture. Automatic washers and dryers are issued to on-base quarters, including private units, and to those off-base units which have the capacity to accommodate these appliances.

## Your Travel To Misawa Air Base

You will travel to Japan by MAC or military contract jet and you'll land at either Yokota AB or Tokyo International Airport. In either case you will ultimately report to Tachikawa Air Base. A USAFSS Liaison office has been established to help you and your dependents. It is located upstairs in the main terminal building. They will arrange for temporary accommodations for you and your family at the Base Guest House and make reservations for your subsequent two hour flight to Misawa. Tachikawa AB is about an hour's train ride from the heart of Tokyo and if you have leave time accrued, it will afford you an excellent opportunity to see the world's largest city.

### *American, MPC And Yen Currency*

United States Military personnel in Japan use Military Payment Certificates (MPC) rather than the standard green back dollar. All U.S. coins are used. Japanese employees are not authorized the use of

MPC, so payment of all domestic servants as well as bills on the economy must be paid in Yen (¥). The current exchange rate (MPC to Yen only) is \$1-¥360.

## Housing

### *NCO And Airman Billeting*

There are presently 14 two story dormitories which house airmen and NCOs assigned to the 6921st Security Wing and 6989th Support Squadron. Trick workers have their own dorms with a separate level for each flight. Straight day workers have their own dorms and NCOs also have two barracks with refrigerators and other luxuries. Each individual may arrange his room to suit himself.

For a small monthly fee, Japanese women, known as mama-sans, perform the janitorial chores in the dorms, clean individual rooms, polish shoes, and make beds. For a small additional charge, the mama-sans will also launder most of your clothing.

## *Government Family Housing*

All government family housing is situated on the host base located approximately four and a half miles from the 6921st Security Wing complex. It consists of 665 units, 146 of which are officer quarters. These are the one and two story capehart dwellings and 26 Commodity Credit Housing Units (eight families per building) with a total of 208 apartments. There are also private on-base dwellings (trailers) which contain from two to four bedroom units. All quarters are equipped with electric stoves, automatic washers and dryers. These on-base private houses are similar to small bungalows. Owners receive their rental allowances, but must pay for all utilities and repairs. Both trailer housing units and off-base private homes are heated with oil burners. The oil is purchased at the Base Exchange and delivered by a concessionaire.

## *Off-Base Housing*

Most of the off-base housing is concentrated within a two mile area of the base. All homes must meet established housing standards as verified by base housing officials before occupancy. All sales and rentals are processed through the Base Housing Office. Almost all quarters are one family units finished with stucco. For private homes purchase prices vary from \$1500 to \$6000 for the better three and four bedroom units. Rentals range from \$30 to \$90 a month, with utilities averaging from \$25 to \$50 a month. Furniture for these quarters is provided just as it is for on-base government housing.

## *Officer Billeting*

There is no Bachelor Officers Quarters located in the Security Wing area. The main base however, provides modern dorms which contain a living room, bedroom and bath. Rooms are completely furnished including desks, bookcases, Hollywood beds, and upholstered furniture. All units contain refrigerators and kitchenettes. Mama-sans, whose services are provided for a nominal fee, take care of cleaning rooms, washing laundry and dry cleaning.

## **Religious Programs**

The 6921st Security Wing boasts of an active and varied Chaplain program for both military members and their dependents. The Wing has a Catholic and Protestant chaplain assigned as well as two chaplain assistants. Located in the new Wing Community Center, the Chaplain section consists of a large Protestant Chapel and a small Sacred Heart Catholic Chapel. An inclosed nursery with a one-way see through mirror is located in the rear of the main chapel for infants who require baby sitting. Services included are worship services every Sunday for Protestant personnel and two masses on Sunday and a daily mass for Catholics. The Security Wing has its own Protestant Choir and various religious social programs are held on a regular basis.

The main base also has a full Chaplain program with Protestant and Catholic services. Denominational services are also held on the Main Base for the Church of Christ, Episcopal Church, Latter Day Saints and Assemblies of God on a weekly basis. In Misawa City there are three English Language congregations; Calvary Baptist, Roman Catholic and Pentecostal.

# Clubs

## *Misawa Officer's Open Mess*

The Misawa AB Officers' Open Mess is one of the most modern Clubs in Japan offering both stateside and Japanese entertainment. A barber shop is available as well as a steam bath and massage room. In the basement of the club there is a game room as well as a bar and card room.

## *Rocker Club*

Located on the host base, the recently renovated Rocker Club offers its members complete recreational facilities under one roof. It features its own orchestra nightly, a beautiful cocktail lounge, game room, stag bar and barber shop.

## *Airmen's Club*

A recently renovated cocktail lounge with padded swivel bar stools, piano bar, and fireplace make the Airmen's Club, which is also located on the main base, a most comfortable and attractive place to frequent. The Club also features a dining room, snack bar, and barber shop.

## *Static Club*

The Static Club located in the Security Wing area is open to all enlisted members of the 6921st Security Wing and their dependents. It boasts all the features of a regular NCO Club. Top flight entertainers, plus regularly scheduled activities add up to a full calendar. Reasonably priced meals coupled with a patio and Arcade are some of the features that the Club offers.

# To Serve You

## *Wing Community Center*

The 6921st Security Wing Community Center was opened last year and was designed to offer all the services normally found on a big base under one roof. In addition to housing the Wing's religious facility, the Community Center also features a complete APO post office with stamp and parcel post concession. A small dispensary and Dental Clinic are also available to military members only. Dependents utilize the ultra-modern hospital and Dental Clinic on the main base. Speciality Services and clinics are available in internal medicine, pediatrics, general surgery, obstetrics, and gynecology. Full general dental care as well as care in the specialities of oral surgery are also available to care for the needs of the military member and his dependents.

The Community Center also features a small but very adequate Base Exchange, Snack Bar, American Express Banking Facility, Oriental Mart, Barber Shop, and Tailor concession.

## *Base Commissary And Exchange*

The Base Commissary is supported by the U.S. Army Depot near Tokyo and offers an adequate selection of stateside products. While choices may not be as varied as a modern supermarket, a good selection of all necessities are stocked.

A larger version of the Base Exchange found in the Community Center in the Security Wing area, the main base facility offers a much larger selection of merchandise. Luggage, jewelry, cameras, and other selected items can be purchased for about 50 per cent less than in the states.

## *Laundry*

Laundry and dry cleaning pick up and delivery points can be found in the Wing Community Center as well as other locations scattered throughout Misawa AB.

## *Radio And Television*

Misawa Air Base has its own Radio and Television Station designed to serve the American Community. An affiliate of the Far East Network, the station pro-

vides 24 hour radio service with hourly newscasts. Channel 73 transmits TV programs on the average of 60 hours per week. Current stateside television programs provide the bulk of TV programming.

## *Service Station And Garage*



## *Schools*




## *Education Center*



## Lake Ogawara



## Local Color

Japan, according to some observers, is a state of mind; to others, it is just a completely unique nation, unlike any on earth. To the traveling serviceman, it is both, and of course a lot more.

The Japanese people are remarkably homogenous in appearance and attitudes. Their standard of living, while not yet up to the level of most Western European Countries and the United States is by far the highest in Asia, and is rapidly rising.

Except for luxuries, Japan is self supporting for its food. The average diet consists of many starches, usually in the form of rice, and protein in the form of fish and occasionally, meat.

## Japanese Manners and Customs

Although Japan is becoming more and more westernized there are still some differences in customs. Listed below are a few which may help you:

1. In writing names Japanese always write the family name first and the personal name last.

2. When greeting, Japanese prefer to bow rather than shake hands.

3. Generally the practice of tipping as observed in the U.S. and Europe is frowned upon.

4. The custom of ladies first is not generally observed in Japan. It is the man who usually receives the courtesies.

5. When invited to a Japanese home or any hotel or inn always remove your shoes in the vestibule. They will be waiting for you when you decide to leave.

# Points Of Local Interest

## *Misawa City*

A town of approximately 40,000, Misawa City is located just beyond the main gate. The primary industry of Misawa City is the Air Base. Agriculture is the secondary industry and some mining for low grade iron ore is done along the coastal area. Misawa City has numerous tailor shops, cabarets and restaurants which have been opened primarily for American personnel. Trading is easy and many Japanese goods may be purchased without any language barrier.

## *Aomori And Hachinohe*

For those who want to get away from it all, the neighboring towns of Aomori and Hachinohe offer the traveler large shopping centers, department stores, movie houses and beautiful parks. The ocean going ferry links Aomori with Hakodate and the northernmost island in the Japanese chain, Hokkaido.

## *Towada City*

Towada City can be reached by private car, bus or electric train. The town is typically Japanese with only very small traces of American influence. Only 11 miles from Misawa City, Towada is the gateway to a nationally famous 106,000 acre park and ski area.

## *Asamushi And Owani*

Less than 100 miles away from Misawa AB the cities of Asamushi and Owani are noted for their hot springs and "Spa Hotels." Temperatures of these spas range from 80 to 260 degrees fahrenheit. While public bathing is still practiced in Japan, private facilities for Americans are available. Etiquette demands that you wash yourself first before entering the hot bath. In Owani the hot springs are saline and radioactive. The baths are good for rheumatism, anemia, gout, etc. Many interesting shrines and a boat trip around the bay are additional features.

## *Hirosaki*

The city of Hirosaki is a favorite tourist attraction for Americans. A two and half hour drive by car, Hirosaki is noted for its apple industry and famous old castle. Hundreds visit the quaint little city every year for its Cherry Blossom and Star Festival celebrations.

During the winter, Northern Japan is a paradise for winter sportsmen. Ski lodges abound throughout the area and ski meets are held regularly until the snow vanishes from the Japanese landscape.




